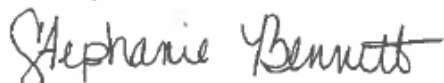

**IN RE: APPROVAL OF INSPECTION AGREEMENT FOR FIRE ALARM SYSTEM WITH SECURITECH LLC FOR COURTHOUSE AND JAIL**

A motion was made by Commissioner Walker to approve the Inspection Agreement for the Fire Alarm System with Securitech LLC for Courthouse and Jail, and noting no objections motion carried.

**SecuriTech, LLC**  
**Fire Alarm System Test & Inspection Agreement**

This Agreement, made on the 26th day of March, 2026 by and between SecuriTech, LLC, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor" and Pocahontas County Commission (Courthouse and Jail), hereinafter referred to as the "Customer" sets forth the terms and conditions for the equipment and services to be provided by Contractor to Customer.

**Terms and Conditions:**

**Scope of Work:** Inspections and diagnostic tests for the accessible peripheral devices currently connected to the facility fire alarm system will be tested by NICET trained technicians in accordance with NFPA 72. Tests will be scheduled in advance. Unless specified in this Agreement, any inspections and testing provided hereunder do not include any maintenance, repairs, alterations, replacement of parts or any field adjustments whatsoever, nor does it include the correction of any deficiencies identified by the Contractor to Customer. Contractor shall not be responsible for equipment failure occurring while Contractor is in the process of following its inspection techniques, where the failure results from the age or obsolescence of the item or due to normal wear and tear. This Agreement does not cover systems, equipment, components or parts that are inaccessible due to being located behind walls or other obstructions or below grade.

Replacement of failed batteries will be provided at no extra cost.

**Code Compliance:** Contractor does not undertake an obligation to inspect for compliance with laws or regulations unless specifically stated in this Agreement. Customer acknowledges that the Authority Having Jurisdiction (e.g. Fire Marshal) may establish additional requirements for compliance with local codes. Any additional services or equipment required will be provided at an additional cost to Customer.

**Documentation:** Accessible components and devices will be logged for:

- Location of each device tested, including system address or zone location
- Test results and applicable voltage readings
- Any discrepancies or deficiencies will be noted in the Inspection Report

**Initial Term:** The work to be performed under this Agreement shall be commenced on May 1, 2026 and shall be completed on May 31, 2026. The term of the Agreement shall commence on the date of the Agreement and continue for the period indicated in this Agreement.

**Contract Price:** Customer shall pay Contractor for services to be performed under this Agreement the sum of **\$2,405.00 (no sales tax)**. The pricing set forth in this Agreement is based on the number of devices and services to be performed as set forth in this Agreement. If the actual number of devices installed or services to be performed is greater than set forth in this Agreement, the price will be increased accordingly. Work performed on a time and material basis shall be at the then-prevailing SecuriTech, LLC rate for material, labor, and related items in effect at the time supplied under this Agreement. Contractor may increase prices upon notice to the Customer or annually to reflect increases in material and labor costs.

**Payments:** Payment shall be due thirty (30) days from the invoice date.

**Limitation of Liability:** Limitations of Remedy. It is understood and agreed by the Customer that Contractor is not an insurer and that insurance coverage, if any, shall be obtained by the Customer. Amounts payable to Contractor hereunder are based upon the value of the service and the scope of liability set forth in this Agreement and are unrelated to the value of the Customer's property and the property of others located on the premises. IN NO EVENT, SHALL CONTRACTOR BE LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGE, LOSS, INJURY OR ANY OTHER CLAIM ARISING FROM ANY SERVICING, ALTERATIONS, MODIFICATIONS, CHANGES, OR OTHER MOVEMENTS OF THE COVERED SYTEM(S) OR ANY OF ITS COMPONENTS BY THE CUSTOMER OR ANY THIRD PARTY. The limitations of liability set forth in this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of all parents, subsidiaries and affiliates of Contractor whether direct or indirect, Contractor's employees, agents, officers, and directors and assigns.

**Hazardous Materials:** This Agreement does not provide for the cost of capture, containment or disposal of any hazardous waste materials or hazardous materials encountered in any of the covered system(s) and/or during performance of the services. Said material shall at all times remain the responsibility and property of the Customer. Contractor shall not be responsible for the testing, removal or disposal of such hazardous materials.

**Change Orders:** Any alteration or deviation from the above specifications, including but not limited to, any such alteration or deviation involving additional material and/or labor costs, will be performed only upon a written order for same, signed by Customer and Contractor and, if there is any charge for such alteration or deviation, the additional charge will be added to the price of this Agreement.

**General:**

1. All work shall be completed in a workman-like manner and in compliance with all building codes and other applicable laws. Work shall be performed between the hours of 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM Monday through Friday (excluding holidays), unless other hours have been agreed upon by the Customer and Contractor due to extenuating circumstances. To the extent required by law, all work shall be performed by individuals duly licensed and authorized by law to perform said work.
2. Contractor warrants it is adequately insured for injury to its employees and others incurring loss or injury as a result of the act of Contractor or its employees or subcontractors.
3. Contractor shall not be liable for any delay or failure to render services due to circumstances beyond its control including strikes, casualty, civil disobedience or unrest, severe weather, floods, natural disasters, general unavailability of materials or any other cause beyond the control of the Contractor.

**Customer Responsibilities:**

1. Provide Contractor clear access to covered system(s) to be serviced including, if applicable, lift trucks or other equipment needed to reach inaccessible equipment.
2. Supply required schematics and/or drawings, a listing of all peripheral equipment and locations included in the system, and access codes.
3. Notify all required persons, including but not limited to authorities having jurisdiction, employees, and monitoring services, of scheduled testing and/or repair of systems.
4. Provide a list of names and telephone numbers of all persons that should be notified in the event of an alarm.
5. Coordinate technicians' schedules for any devices that control HVAC systems or elevators to have appropriate personnel on site during inspection.
6. Notify Contractor of any hazardous materials or conditions, risk of infectious disease or confined spaces prior to commencement of any work by Contractor. If hazardous conditions or materials are encountered by Contractor during the course of Contractor's work, the discovery shall constitute an event beyond the Contractor's control and Contractor shall have no obligation to further perform in the area where the hazard exists.
7. Comply with all laws, codes, and regulations pertaining to the equipment and/or services provided under this Agreement.

**Termination:** Contractor may terminate this Agreement immediately at its sole discretion upon the occurrence of any Event of Default as hereinafter defined.

**Default:** An Event of Default shall include:

- any full or partial termination of this Agreement by Customer before the expiration of the then-current term
- failure of the Customer to pay any amount within thirty (30) days of the invoice date

- failure by Customer to observe, keep or perform any term of this Agreement
- dissolution, termination, discontinuance, insolvency, or business failure

Upon default, Contractor may pursue one or more of the following remedies:

- discontinue furnishing services,
- by written notice to Customer declare the balance of unpaid amounts under this Agreement immediately due and payable
- receive immediate possession of any equipment for which Customer has not paid

**Customer Acceptance:** By signing this Agreement, the Customer agrees to the terms and conditions set forth herein and any attachments or riders hereto attached containing additional terms and conditions. Any changes in the system or its components requested by the Customer after the execution of this Agreement shall be paid for by the Customer and such changes will be authorized by a written Change Order.

Janet McNeel spoke to the commission with concerns of no ambulance service in the southern end of the County. Commissioner Rebinski informed her that there is coverage from the Marlinton dispatch. Janet McNeel also spoke on behalf of the Solid Waste Authority.

Savannah Lambert attended by Zoom and through the disabilities act she requested that an email letter be read to the commission concerning the Solid Waste Authority.

Stephen Snyder - Agenda Item 9:10 am.

Good morning,

My name is Savannah Lambert, and I'm here today because I care deeply about Pocahontas County—where I come from, and the people who built it.

I recently submitted a formal notice to this Commission regarding serious concerns with the Solid Waste Authority, including an oath of office that expired in 2015 and was not renewed until March 31st of this year—an 11-year gap—along with issues involving governance, oversight, and potential conflicts of interest.

That is not a small issue. That is the foundation of lawful authority.

But this is not just about law—it's about people.

I was there when the tannery closed. I watched hardworking men—men like my grandfather—stand there angry and hurt after losing their livelihoods. That kind of loss doesn't just affect income—it affects dignity. As a child, that left a lasting impact on me.

This county was built on people like that.

My family, like many others, has served this community. This is a place where people still come together—but that way of life is fading.

We're seeing businesses close, parts of the county left behind, a struggling school system, unchallenged positions, and long-term population decline. Yet we're told the public "isn't showing interest."

The truth is—people are trying to survive. They do not have time to monitor their government to ensure it is following the law.

That responsibility belongs here.

Under West Virginia Code §7-1-3, this Commission is responsible for the county's administration and oversight, including addressing concerns about the legality of officials and the integrity of county-connected boards.

What is most concerning is the lack of clear acknowledgment that these issues are being fully reviewed.

So today, I am requesting:

- Verification of oath of office compliance and its implications.
- Review of Solid Waste Authority governance and oversight.
- Transparency in procurement and financial agreements.
- Evaluation of actions taken during any period of noncompliance.
- Examination of any conflicts of interest.

And if necessary, referral to appropriate authorities.

This is not about accusations—it is about making sure the system works for the people.

**The people who built this county gave everything they had—doing this right is the least that can be given back to them. And the people still here deserve to know their government is working for them, with transparency, accountability, and respect.**

I respectfully request that this statement be entered into the official record.

**RESOLUTION OF THE POCAHONTAS COUNTY COMMISSION APPROVING INVOICES RELATING TO DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION AND OTHER SERVICES FOR THE POCAHONTAS MEMORIAL HOSPITAL HVAC/ROOF REPLACEMENT PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING PAYMENT THEREOF,**

**WHEREAS,** Pocahontas County Commission has reviewed the invoices attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference relating to the design and/or construction of the Pocahontas Memorial Hospital HVAC/Roof Replacement Project funded by a CDBG-CV and finds as follows:

- a) That none of the items for which the payment is proposed to be made has formed the basis for any disbursement heretofore made.
- b) That each item for which the payment is proposed to be paid is or was necessary in connection with the project and constitutes a cost of the project.
- c) That each of such costs has been otherwise properly incurred.
- d) That payment for each of the items proposed is due and owing as the date hereof.

**WHEREAS,** the Pocahontas County Commission will deposit the project funds into the Project Account and will apply said proceeds to the payment of eligible invoices received by the Pocahontas County Commission. 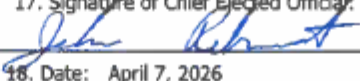

Gentlemen,

I am volunteering for appointment to Ed Riley's unexpired term on the PCSWA.

I have long been keenly interested in both environmental protection and in resource conservation, the two key missions of Solid Waste Authorities in West Virginia. This interest led me to over twenty years of faithful attendance at the monthly meetings of our PCSWA, starting in 1989, through 2009. This was twenty years of frustration, as I watched, and protested, and suggested changes to, the regulations and practices of the SWA, that led inevitably to the crisis we face today.

I sought and received appointment by the WVDEP to a term on the Authority toward the end of that period, and was actually elected Chairman for a year. Unfortunately, while I did create SWA policies of responsiveness to public inquiry and financial transparency during that time, I did not have the votes to modify the SWA's fee structure to conform to my understanding of the mandates of the WV Code, and to create a financial incentive for the redirection of waste and conservation of landfill space, which would have long-delayed if not prevented the end of our landfill.

Reduction of waste volume and recycling are as necessary going forward, as they were all along, since transportation and tipping costs are headed nowhere but up. Neither has West Virginia law changed, which prescribes a "Waste Hierarchy" which ranks avoidance first, recycling second, and landfilling dead last. (WV Code §22-15-1(c)(5), §22C-4-1(6)) These principles can be incorporated in our new system much more cheaply in the design phase, than when escalating cost or closure of receiving landfills, forces the issue.

Someone is bound to bring up the fact that I fought the SWA's current fee structure through the courts over several years, in the sincere belief that the law as well as common sense required changes. The WV Supreme Court ultimately disagreed with me, and I have complied fully with PCSWA's regulations since then.

In addition to the experience and perspective that I describe above, I have practiced mechanical engineering, and repair and construction of all types of machinery for nearly fifty years, I have worked in and studied the recycling industry both here and in other States and subscribe to industry publications. I have a working knowledge both of the WV Law regarding Solid Waste, and of the engineering and operation of landfills as well as of recycling facilities.
